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


#### Dear New to the Biz -

Wanting to share GAGA members' feelings and Covid-19 coping strategies, a call for thoughts was put to GAGA members. That job fell to Pamela Ferguson who began compiling them into this co-authored essay.

In collecting, reading, and re-reading member responses on how we've coped during these months, I learned so much about the spirit of artists. The closed doors become portals to
